Dear Senator Truman:

This will acknowledge your letter of February 22nd enclosing a letter dated February 18th from Mr. Edward V. Long of Bowling Green, Missouri, in regard to the latter's offer of employment to Miss Ayako Sunada of the Minidoka War Relocation Project.

We had cleared Miss Sunada for leave from the Project, but prior to her departure she notified our office that she had received a communication from her prospective employer, Mr. Long, stating that he had been reclassified by Selective Service and expected to enter the Army at an early date. Miss Sunada stated that, in view of her prospective employer's reclassification, his offer of employment had been cancelled.
