My dear Miss Brancato:

I have for acknowledgment your communication of October fifth. In compliance with your request, I am enclosing a copy of the President's Message to the House of Representatives of June twenty-fifth returning H.R. 5678, the proposed Immigration and Nationality Act, without approval.

In his message he stated his conviction that the bill was a step backward in the immigration and naturalization policy of our country. Unfortunately this action by the President failed by two votes of being sustained in the Senate. It is now Public Law 444, and a copy may be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.

For your information and ready reference, I am also enclosing a copy of the President's Executive Order of September fourth establishing a special Commission on Immigration and Naturalization, to study and evaluate the immigration and naturalization policies of the United States, together with a copy of the President's statement issued in connection with the establishment of this Commission.

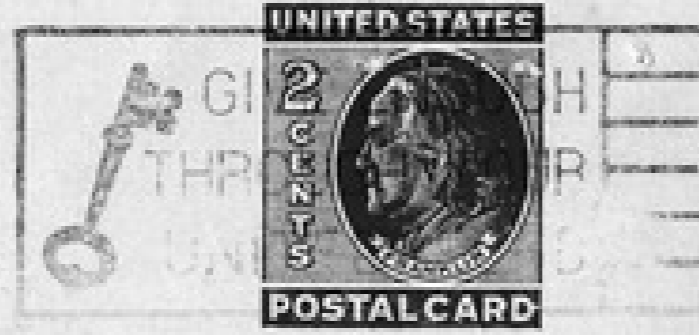
