you to champion our cause.

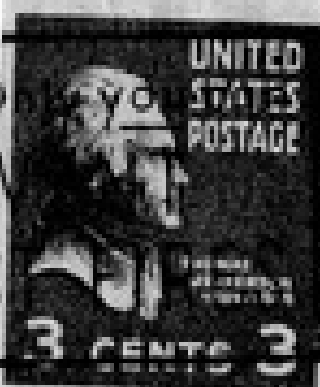
