My dear Mr. President:

In further reference to the McCarran Immigration Bill,  
I wish to offer you some personal observations. #

I have attended all the hearings held by Congressional  
Committees regarding the McCarran - Walter Immigration  
Bills. I have read and digested both of them thoroughly.

The approval of such a law on your part would mean a  
political disaster to the Democratic Party just at a  
time when we need the assistance of every voter in the  
Country. The numerous minority groups who have been  
"fighting" the McCarran bill would certainly and  
effectively register their resentment at the polls.  
This is something we must take into consideration at  
this time.

For many years I have been your ardent admirer and  
supporter and I have the utmost confidence that you  
will not do anything which may tend to defeat a  
Democratic candidate for President.

The unfortunate part about the McCarran- Walter bills is  
that they have been introduced and supported by Democratic  
leaders in the Senate and the House of Representatives.

These are my personal views about this matter from the  
political standpoint, and not those of the organization  
which I represent. I hope, Mr. President, that my  
opinions are received in the same spirit they are given -  
a true American and an active Democrat.
